

This year the FGA will accept payments of annual dues and tournament fees in one of 2 ways:

1. **Cash only** (correct change) at the FGA check in table prior to the tournament or
2. In advance (by noon on the Friday preceding a tournament) through **PayPal**. YOU MUST STILL SIGN UP ONLINE ON THE FIREWHEEL WEB SITE.

NO PERSONAL CHECKS WILL BE ACCEPTED !!

Green fee, cart fee and skins pot money (cash only) will need to be paid at the course prior to each tournament.

PayPal

PayPal is an online computer system to transfer funds either by credit card or direct transfers from your checking account. It is very easy to set up an account by going to their web site at www.PayPal.com. When you set up you account you will need a valid credit card or checking account information including routing number and account number. The FGA would appreciate your setting up a "verified" account by inputting you checking account information so that we can eliminate the fees associated with the transfer of funds.

After you have setup your account you will need to log in. Then click the second tab at the top of this page which says "Send Money". At this point you will need to enter the payee's (the FGA) e-mail address and the amount of the transfer. Annual dues are \$40, Hole-in-one club is \$5, single day tournament fees are \$25 and two-day tournament fees are \$45. Please pay in as few transactions as possible to reduce the transfer fees. For example, if you want to pay your annual dues and Hole-in-one Club please make a single payment of \$45 as opposed to one payment of \$40 and one payment of \$5. If you know you are playing in the January tournament please add \$25 to the total and make a single payment.
